
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
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
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COVID-19 Impact to Jobs – Southwest Montana

- COVID-19 pandemic shut-downs beginning in late March saw the number of unemployed in SW MT increase from 1,819 in February to 4,627 in April. This was a 154% increase in the number of unemployed in a 2 month time-period. The retail, services and leisure/hospitality industries were hit hardest. Fiscal stimulus in 2020 helped.
- The unemployment rate increased from 4.2% in February to 11.3% in April at its peak. It declined each month since April and ended November at 4.1%. The current 4.1% November unemployment rate is up from the 3.6% rate in November 2019, with 200 more workers unemployed.







In **November 2019**, we were seeing **all-time low** unemployment rates and tight labor markets. SW MT's unemployment rate was **3.6%**, similar to the overall MT average. **Unemployed in SW MT totaled 1,514**.



In April 2020, we were seeing all-time high unemployment rates with COVID-19 shutdowns. SW MT's unemployment rate was 11.3%, better than the MT average of 11.9%.






- SW MT's population totaled 84,598 from the 2019 census estimate. The population has increased 3.2% or 2,656 people since 2010. SW MT growth has been slower than the overall statewide increase of 8.0% since 2010.
- Growth in SW MT accelerated between 2016 and 2018, averaging 0.9% increase per year. 2019 saw an estimated decline of 141 people, or -0.2%.
- The median age of the population in 2019 was 44.0 years. SW MT has an older population than the overall statewide average.




<u>Labor Force – Southwest Montana</u>

- SW MT's labor force (employed + unemployed) totaled 41,314 workers in November 2020.
 Silver Bow County accounts for approximately 41% of the SW MT labor force.
- Between 2019 and 2020, SW MT's labor force fell by 687 workers or 1.6% due to a reduction of 879 employed workers or 2.2%, offset by an increase of 192 unemployed workers.
- Employment reductions were seen in all counties with the exception of Beaverhead.
- SW MT's unemployment rate at 4.1% is better than the overall statewide average of 4.9%.











Per-Capita Income - BEA





- Per-Capita Income averaged \$49,747 in MT in 2019. This was approximately 12% below the U.S average.
 MT ranked 34th of the 50 states in terms of per-capita income.
- Madison County had SW MT's highest per-capita income at \$53,567 and ranked 7th highest in MT. Silver
 Bow at \$49,285 was similar to the statewide average and ranked 20th of MT's 56 counties. Granite, Powell,
 and Deer Lodge counties fell well below the overall statewide average.
- Between 2010 and 2019, Powell grew an average of 5.6% per year the fastest in SW MT. Silver Bow grew an average of 1.5% per year which was the slowest growth in SW MT.

Real Gross Domestic Product - BEA






- Real GDP, which measures final goods and services produced and spending totaled \$3.17 billion in SW MT in 2019. This was an increase of 2.1% per year on average since 2010, and exceeded the statewide annual average increase of 1.8% per year. Madison and Beaverhead counties showed the fastest SW MT counties increase in production since 2010 at 5.4% and 4.7% per year respectively.
- Production and spending in Silver Bow County totaled \$1.43 billion in 2019, which accounted for approximately 45% of the overall SW MT total. Growth since 2010 in Silver Bow County was the slowest of the 7 counties, averaging 0.7% per year.




- Silver Bow County had a 2019 census estimated population of nearly 34,915 people, and is the 8th largest of MT's 56 counties. Since 2010, SBC's population increased 715 people or 2.1%, which ranked 28th of MT's 56 counties. MT's population increased 79,363 people or 8.0% since 2010 and was the 16th fastest growing state.
- Between 2010 and 2019, the growth in SBC population occurred in those 65 years and older (+1,194 people or 21.3% increase), and those 18-44 (+765 people or 6.7% increase), offset by those age 45-64 (-1,130 or -11.3%), and those under age 17 (-114 people or -1.6%).





- Silver Bow Counties total employed peaked in 2007 prior to the Great Recession at 16,954 workers.
 By 2011, employment had fallen 1,052 to 15,902 workers. Between 2011 and 2019 employment grew an average of 0.5% per year, adding 668 workers and ending 2019 at 16,570. With COVID impacting 2020, the number employed in November was 16,095, which was down 475 workers from the November 2019 level. Very slow but steady growth had been occurring in Silver Bow County.
- In terms of private covered employment by industry, in 2020 Silver Bow County saw a reduction of 408 workers between 2019 and 2020. The majority of the job losses were in the accommodation and food services industry, and the retail trade industry.

Discussion and Outlook


- 2020 was a year the impacted everyone, changed how many do business, and negatively impacted
 the overall economy. Continued short-term drag as vaccine roll-out continues is anticipated through
 the first half of 2021. Continued improvement in the second half of 2021, followed by stronger
 growth in 2022 and 2023 is anticipated.
- Employment is anticipated to grow 0.8% in 2021, 1.3% in 2022, and 1.5% in 2023. By 2023 the unemployment rate is anticipated to be less than 4%.
- The housing market in Silver Bow County, as with other areas of the state, has become tight. Between 2019 and 2020 prices increased 14% and sales volume increased 9%. The current average list price as of December 2020 was \$220,000.
 - 2019 285 homes sold with an average sales price of \$177,000
 - o 2020 313 homes sold with an average sales price of \$205,000

- 1. Cryptowatt Bitcoin ramping back up after shut-down in 2020
- 2. Wausau is opening a new distribution center in Montana Connections Business Park
- 3. Murdoch's is opening a new distribution center in the Montana Connections Business Park
- 4. Nova Health new urgent care center on Harrison Avenue
- 5. St. James new medical offices just off Harrison Avenue
- 6. Rocky Mountain Eye Care new surgery center off Elizabeth Warren
- 7. Completion of the SW MT Veterans home and Veteran's clinic
- 8. Praxis development in uptown Butte continues to move forward
- 9. New residential sub division, uptown investments, and construction
- 9. Stability from major employers NWE, St. James, Town Pump, MT Tech, MRI, REC, CCCS
- 10. Additional fiscal stimulus in 2021, continuing low interest rates and inflation

- 1. New \$10M hotel and convention center in Anaconda
- 2. Looking at feasability of meat processing facility in Whitehall
- 3. Sun Mountain Lumber in Deer Lodge is ramping up
